

Telephone Betting Rules

INTRODUCTION

Thank you for opening a telebet account with Coral. It is our policy to provide all our customers with a fair and efficient service, which we hope, will enhance their enjoyment of sports betting.

Throughout these rules "Coral", "we", or "us" refers to Coral Racing Limited a subsidiary of Coral Eurobet Holdings Limited. It is a condition of holding a telebet account with Coral that customers agree to accept these rules. By registering, a customer is deemed to have fully accepted and understood these rules.

The following rules, which cancel all previous rules, are framed to meet the generally accepted rules of betting and govern all future transactions between us. We suggest that for your own guidance you study them carefully.

When deciding whether to accept your registration or otherwise, we may supply the information you have given us to authorised credit reference agencies to confirm your identity and card details. They will check any details we disclose to them against any databases (public or private) to which they have access and will keep a record of that check. You agree that we may process, use, record and disclose personal information which you provide in connection with your registration and that such personal data may be recorded by us or them. For your protection, any telephone calls to our Call Centre may be recorded and monitored.

Coral reserve the right to make changes to these terms and conditions.

Our rules are a guide and reference to the terms by which we do business. Although our rules cover the vast majority of transactions there may be instances where an occurrence is not covered by our rules. In these rare instances we will seek to settle in an equitable and fair manner. However in the case that our settlement is disputed we will refer the matter to an independent arbiter (IBAS) and abide by their ruling. No claims or disputes will be considered more than 13 weeks after the date of the original transaction.

The placing of a bet with Coral, signifies your acceptance of our rules, whether or not you have familiarised yourself with them.

You must be 18 years or older to open and use an account. Any customer may be credit checked on application in order to prove their legal age. Coral reserve the right to request proof of age documentation from any client. Accounts may be suspended pending clarification.

In the event of a bet being placed by a person under 18 the account will be suspended and no returns will be processed until age verification checks have proved the account holder to be 18 years or over.

We reserve the right to close your account without notice; if this is the case we will confirm your account closure in writing. Our decision will be final and no further correspondence will be entered into.

Accounts must be opened by the card holder.

The customer has the right to close an account at any time, providing the account does not show a balance is due to us. A customer should indicate their desire to close an account by telephone, or in writing. In this case, the customer shall be sent the sum on deposit in their account. Should the customer have placed bets, the outcome of which is as yet unknown, and which subsequently win, the corresponding sums shall be sent later when the bet is completed.

Privacy Policy

This privacy policy sets out the data processing practices carried out by Coral. Any personal information the customer supplies to Coral will only be used by us for the purposes of determining the customer's suitability as a betting customer, processing bets and maintaining the customer's account. Provided that the customer has indicated their acceptance, then Coral may from time to time contact the customer regarding related products and services that may be of interest. Likewise, provided that the customer has indicated their acceptance Coral may from time to time disclose personal information to other companies or business partners who may also contact the customer regarding their products or services. Where required by law, your personal information may also be disclosed to an applicable governmental, regulatory, sporting or enforcement authority. Additionally, your personal information may be disclosed to any fraud prevention organisation or regulatory or sporting body in connection with policing the integrity or enforcing the rules of a sport or game and/or prevention and detection of crime and with whom Coral has agreements from time to time for the sharing of such data and where Coral considers that there are reasonable grounds to suspect that you may be involved in a breach of such rules or the law, have knowledge of a breach of such rules or the law or otherwise pose a threat to the integrity of the relevant sport or game. Those bodies may then use your personal information to investigate and act on any such breaches in accordance with their procedures. Coral may use information that it collects from you when placing a bet to collate statistics and betting patterns. By placing a bet, you consent to Coral's use of such information.

In addition to agreeing to these Terms and Conditions and Privacy Policy, by accessing our products and services you also agree that you are complying with any Terms and Conditions or Rules as specified by any Sport's Governing Body to which you may be associated. We reserve the right to void any bet placed in breach of such regulations (or withhold payment pending investigation), or where instructed to do so by the appropriate regulator.

Bet Acceptance Procedure

The process of accepting a bet via telephone is as follows:

- State your name, account number and password (if applicable)
- State the bet you would like to place
- The operator will then read back your bet(s)
- You should then confirm that these details are correct*
- Wait for full confirmation prior to terminating the call (i.e. wait for confirmation that the bet has been accepted by Coral and that funds are available)**

*Please listen carefully and point out any discrepancies immediately as bets will stand in accordance with our telephonist's verbal confirmation at the end of the call: in accordance with our rules and subject to any correction made by the caller at the time.

** If the call is terminated prior to completion of bet confirmation it is the customer's responsibility to call back immediately to restate the bet and complete the transaction. Otherwise the bet will stand providing we are satisfied as to the intended instructions, that sufficient funds are available, and conditional on those instructions being acceptable to us. We reserve the right to refuse any bet either in whole or in part.

General

Minimum stake per call £10, bets must be placed by telephone, no postal or facsimile bets are accepted and if received will be void win or lose.

Customers should not reveal their Personal Registration/Account Number to anyone else. Account holders are responsible for all bets where the person placing the bet has correctly quoted their name and Personal Registration/Account Number. With prior agreement you may authorise a named third party to place bets on your behalf using your account. We reserve the right to refuse payment where it becomes apparent that bets placed were made by someone other than the account holder where an arrangement had not been made with us in advance. It is also the customer's sole responsibility to ensure that all information supplied is accurate and up to date at all times.

From time to time speciality bets may be introduced and these will be settled in accordance with the applicable rules for such bets (stated within the Speciality Bets section).

Free Bets

From time to time we may offer customers free bets. When this is the case this will normally be communicated in writing, or will be featured in our press advertising. Terms and conditions for these free bets will be featured within these communications and form part of our rules. Free bet stakes will not be included in any returns, for example if a customer redeems a £10 free bet on a 3/1 shot and their selection wins, they will receive a return £30 not £40. We reserve the right to refuse to allow a customer to redeem a free bet offer.

Betting Against Returns

Coral allow debit account customers to bet against your returns on a daily basis, as well as throughout the weekend from Friday to Sunday. For example if you have a successful day on Friday or Saturday you can use your returns the next day.

This means that we won't have to keep debiting your card each time you place a bet, as long as you have sufficient funds in your betting account. Placing a bet will therefore be quicker and the impact on your bank account cashflow will be reduced. This is available to all debit account customers, however if you would like to opt out of this service simply mention this to an operator next time you call.

Other Promotional Offers

Likewise we may also offer other promotions such as enhanced returns or guaranteed odds. Again when this is the case this will normally be communicated in writing, or will be featured in our press advertising. Terms and conditions for these offers will be featured within these communications and form part of our rules. We reserve the right to refuse to allow a customer to redeem a promotional offer.

DEBIT CARD ACCOUNTS

It is the customer's responsibility to advise us of any changes to the details originally registered, as failure to do so may result in the debit card authority declining the request for funds which will render the intended bet void.

All bets are accepted subject to the relevant debit card acceptance procedures. Where immediate authorisation cannot be obtained from the Debit Card Authority, the bet will be accepted subject to subsequent authorisation being given. Should the transaction be subsequently declined by the Bank/Building Society as unauthorised, all bets will be void, win or lose. It is the customer's responsibility to ensure that sufficient funds are available for all stake monies invested at the time the bet is struck. In the event that our request for authorisation of stake monies is declined, it is the responsibility of the customer to investigate the decision to decline via their own Bank/Building Society, as at no time are customers account details made available to Coral.

Funds will only be paid to the card from which the bet has been placed.

CREDIT ACCOUNTS

Credit Accounts are available on application.

The company does not undertake to inform customers when their credit limit has been reached as they should keep themselves aware of the position and re-establish their credit as necessary. If a customer has been advised verbally or in writing that (a) the account is closed or (b) that no further bets can be accepted until a remittance to clear the account has been received, then any bets taken subsequently, prior to clearance being given to the account, are void win or lose.

Any outstanding Ante-Post bets, however, stand unless cancelled by mutual consent.

Unless otherwise agreed, accounts are made up on a fortnightly basis and a statement showing the final balance will be sent to you. All balances under £20 win or lose (or as otherwise agreed) are carried forward. If, however, an account is not used during the following accounting period, settlement should be made or claimed. When you have a winning balance over £20 you will receive a cheque with your statement. When you have a losing balance over £20 settlement for the full outstanding balance should reach us within seven days of the account being rendered. We reserve the right to refuse or cancel bets if settlement is not then to hand. In no circumstances are accounts for the following period allowed to offset a previous account. Payment of accounts may be made by any of the following methods.

1. Cheque/Postal Order made payable to Coral Accounts Ltd.
2. By Debit Card. Phone our accounts department 08457 581527 during office hours
3. Cash in any of our Licensed Betting Offices.
4. Via our on course representative.

If you disagree with the statement balance you should send payment for the full amount you consider due together with full details of your query.

Failure to manage an account in accordance with our rules may result in the account being closed without further explanation.

DEPOSIT ACCOUNTS

£50 is the minimum deposit required to open a deposit account. Deposits are accepted via Debit or Credit card payment or cash in one of our Licensed Betting Offices and may then be used immediately. Deposits are accepted by cheque but cannot be used until clearance has been given by our bank. Where a bet is accepted and there are insufficient funds the bet will be settled in proportion to the actual funds available. If a bet is struck when the account is out of funds the bet will be made void win or lose. You may request a check on your balance any time throughout the day however the amount quoted may not include all returns from bets placed that day.

All winnings on a Deposit Account will be carried forward until a payment is requested. Cash payments will not be made; any funds will be credited to the same card the deposit was taken from. If the deposit was paid by cheque, then a cheque will be issued.

RACECOURSE BETTING SERVICE

Your Coral Credit Account enables you to bet on the racecourse with our representatives who are sited on the Members rails at most major meetings.

1. CONDITIONS OF ACCEPTANCE

Subject to these Rules we accept bets for all meetings held under the Rules of The Jockey Club (incorporating the National Hunt Committee) the Irish Turf Club and at the following venues licensed by the National Greyhound Racing Club :

and such other N.G.R.C. tracks that receive live TV coverage or where cards are printed in the National Press.

Instructions issued by means of a Press Announcement are to be read as being part of these Rules.

Any bet accepted in error on an event not covered by the preceding paragraphs, or bets for events outside the direct control of the sports main governing body will be void.

Once accepted a bet can only be altered or cancelled by mutual consent.

Where there is evidence of price, race, match or event rigging, we reserve the right to make bets void or withhold settlement of bets pending the outcome of any subsequent investigation.

2. MAXIMUM PAYMENTS

The maximum payout on any bet or bets involving one or more of the same selections are shown below. These maximum payout amounts will apply even if by taking a price, the level of potential winnings exceeds these amounts.

Where selections are taken from different categories listed below and are combined in multiple or accumulative bets, the lowest maximum payout limit will apply.

Where a range of accumulators or other multiple bets are placed including a common selection(s) the maximum payout will apply to all those bets including that selection, even if the bets are placed over a number of days.

Any group of customers who have placed the same combination of selections and we believe have been acting as a syndicate will be treated as one customer for the purpose of the limits below.

Should a number of bets, containing the same selection(s) be placed in one more of our branches, via telephone and / or internet and we have reason to believe they've originated from one customer or group / syndicate of customers, then we reserve the right to limit the total payment of all those bets combined to the single maximum payout applicable in the rules.

3. SETTLEMENT OF BETS

The advertised times of races, the runners, the returns, and the results as published in the national / sporting press govern the settlement of all bets, errors and omissions excepted. Through-the-Card type instructions are determined by reference to the published race programme, as are the instructions First Race, Last Race, etc.

We settle bets placed on UK and Irish horse racing on both the First Past the Post announcement and the official Weighed In Result (please see Rule 13.1 for further details). Bets on Horse racing from countries other than the UK and Ireland will be settled on the official Weighed in Result only; however customers may place First Past the Post bets on request (see Rule 13.2). Where a result is amended after the Weigh In, for example further to a successful appeal, the amendment will be ignored for settlement purposes.

In the event of no Starting Prices or Industry Starting Prices being returned, selections for a horse race for which a price has not been laid are settled at Tote returns or vice-versa, but greyhound selections for which a price has not been laid are made void and treated for settlement purposes as non-runners. Bets on unnamed favourites will be treated as void for settlement purposes where a Tote price is not available.

Each-way doubles, trebles and accumulators are settled win to win and place to place; unless the instruction each-way all each-way or equally divided is clearly requested by the customer, then the bet is settled by this method.

A bet is deemed to be related if either:

- i) The same selection is chosen to win two or more different events and is combined in an Accumulator or other Multiple bet.
- ii) Different selections are chosen in the same event and combined in an Accumulator or other Multiple bet

The cumulative odds for bets such as these if quoted in error will not apply. Instead your bet will be settled at the special related odds (if they were on offer at the time) or your stakes will be equally divided where any selections which are deemed related clash.

Where a horse and greyhound selection have the same name, the bet will stand for the horse selection, unless otherwise instructed.

Where two or more horses or greyhounds with the same name run in the same race and the customer does not make it clear which selection they intended to back; the bet will stand on the horse with the lowest returned price. If both horses are returned at the same price then the bet will stand on the horse with the lowest race card number.

In the event of a dead heat for first place, the stake money on a winning selection is divided by the number of winners in the dead heat, and the full odds paid to the reduced stake, with the remainder of the stake money being lost.

For example if two horses dead-heat for first place and a customer placed a £20 win single on one of the dead-heated horses, they would receive £10 at the full starting price.

Similar rules apply when dealing with dead-heated placed selections. In the event that the dead –heat on a place does not affect the normal number of places which we would payout on a given event, we would payout the full amount. However, should a dead-heat increase the normal number of placed selections paid we would reduce the stake unit accordingly.

For example if three horses dead-heat for fourth place (in a 16 runner handicap) and a customer place a £15 each-way single, they would receive one third of their stake (£5) at the full place odds.

For Greyhound racing, when instructing either through the card or last X number of races, bets will be settled on the basis of the full race card.

4. FOREIGN RACING

We accept bets on racing abroad providing the runners and/or results are printed in the Racing Post, as advertised in our shops or by press announcement. If a bet is accepted on a race in error, for which we cannot verify the result the bet will be deemed void.

When Industry SP's are in operation these will take precedence for settlement purposes unless 'PM' or 'Pari-mutuel' is clearly marked on the bet.

4.1 S.P. Betting

In countries where bookmakers operate e.g. South Africa and an official starting price is returned, bets are accepted and settled in accordance with Coral rules.

4.2 Pari-Mutuel/Tote Betting

In countries where there is no starting price market in operation bets are accepted at Pari-Mutuel terms for the following:

a) Win & Each Way

The place part of each way bets will be settled in accordance with the returned place dividends, the only exception to this rule is US Racing, where the place part of each way bets will be settled in accordance with the win and show pool. Horses in the same ownership are coupled in the win pool only, where this system is in operation and as advertised by press announcement. Where a coupled horse is a non-runner, win and each way bets specifying the non-runner, will be made void.

b) Forecasts

Straight or Dual Forecasts are accepted depending on the type of forecast in operation.

Should your instructions be for a straight or reversed forecast and a dual forecast is returned your stake will be invested on a dual forecast.

Should your instruction be for a Dual forecast and SFC is in operation your stake will be divided and settled as a reversed forecast.

c) Unnamed favourites

Unnamed favourites are not acceptable and if taken in error will be made void.

d) Tricasts

Tricasts are not accepted on US Racing. Any accepted in error will be made void.

4.3 Show Prices and Industry S.P.

Where SIS or an alternative external supplier provides betting shows and an industry S.P. (e.g. Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe & Breeders cup) the following rules will apply:

a) Bets are acceptable win and each-way at the show prices or industry S.P.

Bets on which a price has not been taken, or pari-mutuel requested, will be settled at the Industry S.P. In the event of any withdrawals Tattersalls rule 4 will apply. Non-runner, no bet.

b) Unnamed favourites are acceptable

Forecasts

A CSF based on the returned Industry S.P, is declared. Forecast bets will be settled on this CSF unless otherwise specified

Tricasts

A Tricast dividend will be declared on handicaps of 8 or more declared runners. Unless acceptance is specifically advertised, Tricasts are not acceptable for any other races.

4.4 Early Prices/Board Prices

Board prices will be available for selected races abroad and must be requested. Where no board price is requested and an industry S.P is returned, bets will be settled at the industry S.P. Where no industry S.P is available, bets will be settled at the pari-mutuel returns.

5. TIME OF ACCEPTANCE

A selection timed for a race which has already run is void.

Where a time and meeting is stated but no selection is given by name or trap number, the favourite in that race is taken as the customer's selection. A selection which cannot be determined by the provisions of this rule are treated as non-runners as are selections for races precluded by our rules.

6. INCORRECT STAKES OR INSTRUCTIONS

Where an incorrect number of doubles is stated to cover the selections given, the total amount staked on the doubles is divided and invested proportionately amongst the correct number of doubles. A similar rule will apply to singles, trebles, fourfolds etc. However, where a double, treble, fourfold etc. is specified and it is clearly indicated that only one accumulative bet is required, it will be settled as an accumulative bet covering the number of selections given.

Where a selection is given both by name and trap or racecard number, the name will take precedence for the purpose of the settlement.

Where a named selection is doubly engaged the bet will stand for the race in which it runs, unless a specific race is requested at the time the bet is placed.

An incorrectly timed selection will be on for the next race at that meeting following the time of acceptance unless the time stated can be related to a greyhound meeting scheduled to be run, in which case the race time will take precedence.

7. QUOTED PRICES

At all horse or greyhound meetings from which we are receiving a Course Betting Service, we will lay the current quoted price of the selection at the time the bet is accepted when this is requested by the customer.

Customers wishing to take a fixed price must clearly inform the operator and ensure the correct fixed price is quoted when the bet is read back at the end of the call. Where a price is laid this will apply to the selection throughout the bet.

Should an incorrect price be transmitted, advertised or given in error by an operator, then the bet will be settled at the correct price at the time the bet was placed or, in the case of horse\greyhound bets, at Starting Price, whichever is the greater.

Overnight Declaration (24 Hour/48 Hour)

A horse race bet laid in accordance with advertised or circulated prices from 10 a.m. on the day of declaration to run is not an Ante-Post bet and in the event of any withdrawals such horse(s) count as non-runners. Bets for remaining horses in that race will be subject to a deduction equivalent to that of Tattersalls Rule 4(c), the rate depending upon the advertised or quoted price(s) of the withdrawn horse(s).

8. ANTE-POST

Ante-Post bets are bets placed at a guaranteed price prior to the event becoming subject to the final declaration stage.

Returns for win and place doubles, trebles etc., are calculated at accumulative odds i.e. in the same manner as for S.P. bets; for the place part of an each-way bet the fractional odds and number of places relating to each event are those pertaining at the time of acceptance. Place Only, conditional or if cash bets are not acceptable at ante-post odds.

A selection scratched from or not taking part in an ante-post event is a losing one, whether or not that selection entered the event.

We reserve the right to correct any obvious or material errors and, in the event of incorrect odds being laid in error, bets will be settled at the odds which were correct at the time the bet was placed.

Horse Racing

Unless advertised differently, the following rules apply:-

(a) Where an event is postponed to another day and overnight declarations stand, then bets stand. If the original overnight declarations do not stand, bets will be void.

(b) If the race is abandoned, declared void or if the conditions of the race are altered after bets are taken or if the horse selected is balloted out under the Jockey Club rule limiting the number of runners in the race, single ante-post bets will be void. Accumulative or combination ante-post bets will stand and are settled at the ante-post price(s) laid on the remaining selection(s), with the void selection counting as a non-runner throughout the bet.

In the event of horses being balloted out the liabilities against the horses remaining may be reduced at the rate announced in accordance with Tattersalls Rule 4(c). If the venue of the race is altered bets will be settled in accordance with Tattersalls ruling.

(c) Ante-post bets placed before the entries have closed should stand and only be made void if the race is abandoned or made void, if the horse is balloted out/eliminated under Jockey Club Rule 125, or the venue is changed.

Ante-post bets placed after the entries have closed should be void, except when the race is run at a later date at the same venue and entries for the race are not reopened, in which case bets would stand.

Greyhounds

When prices are offered to win a competition, bets accepted before the draw for the penultimate round (semi-final) has been made will be on an all in run or not basis, and non runners will be treated as losers.

Bets accepted at prices issued after the draw for the penultimate round (semi final) but prior to the draw for the final will not be subject to Ante-Post rules, and any non runner will be treated as void for settlement purposes. Tattersalls Rule 4 (c) will apply to bets on the remaining greyhounds, with the amount of the deduction based on the price of the withdrawn greyhound at the time that the bet was struck. When a greyhound is withdrawn after the draw for the final is made all bets struck after the draw but prior to withdrawal at Coral prices will be settled at starting price, and bets on the withdrawn greyhound will be void.

Ante Post vouchers will be sent on request for bets with a stake unit exceeding £20. To request a voucher call 08457 581527.

9. FAVOURITES

a) In any race the favourite is the horse quoted in the official Starting Price return at the shortest odds; the second favourite is the horse quoted at the next shortest odds and so on. If two horses should be quoted at the same odds and if these odds should be shorter than those quoted against any other horse then these two horses are the joint first and second favourites.

b) Subject to section (c) of this rule, where a customer uses the term Favourite, Second Favourite or Third Favourite to indicate the selection, the stake will be invested on the horse defined in the preceding section; if two or more horses are thus selected the stake will be divided and invested equally amongst each of the selected horses.

c) Starting price bets for unnamed favourites, or additionally in the case of horse racing for unnamed second or third favourites, are acceptable win only. The place part of any such bet, if taken, will be declared void.

d) Bets for unnamed second or third favourites in Greyhound races are not acceptable and if taken in error will be void.

10. DOUBLY ENGAGED

Where a selection is doubly engaged a timed bet will be on for the race as instructed by the customer, any untimed selection will be settled on the race in which it runs.

11. WIN & PLACE BETTING AT STARTING PRICE

Bets are acceptable win or each-way. Place Only bets are not acceptable, excepting certain speciality bets. Where a place stake is in excess of the amount staked to win, the difference will be equally apportioned win and place to the selection(s).

The place part of a Win and Place bet at Starting Price or displayed price is settled in the following manner:

11.1 Horses

In races of 5-7 runners we pay 1/4 of the win odds 1st and 2nd places.

In races of 8 or more runners we pay 1/5 of the win odds 1st, 2nd and 3rd places.

In handicap races of 12-15 runners we pay 1/4 of the win odds 1st, 2nd and 3rd places.

In handicap races of 16 or more runners we pay 1/4 of the win odds 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th places.

Where there are less than five runners the place money goes on to win.

11.2 Greyhounds

In races of 5-7 runners we pay 1/4 of the win odds 1st and 2nd places.

In races of 8 runners we pay 1/5 of the win odds 1st, 2nd and 3rd places.

Where there are less than five runners the place money goes on to win.

12. CONDITIONAL BETS

Conditional bets may not be placed on ante-post selections.

When settling conditional bets the instruction If Lose will be read as If Lose or Non-Runner and the instruction If Win read as If Win or Non-Runner. Subject to the selections being in different races, Stop at a Winner bets are acceptable win or each-way and settled in the order requested, a non-runner will not be counted as a winner and the bet will continue until one of the selections either occupies or dead heats for the first place.

13. DOUBLE RESULT BETTING

The Double Result concession applies to all UK and Irish bets only. It applies to all singles & multiple bets and there are no restrictions on stake.

Settlement is governed by the result given by the racecourse judge (as transmitted by the 'Course Betting Service') with the following exceptions:

- Ante Post Bets
- Forecasts & Tricasts
- Void Races
- Selection taking the wrong course
- Selection carrying wrong weight
- It's jockey failed to weigh in
- Any Tote or Pari-Mutuel bets
- It was not given in error by the judge
- 'Betting without favourites' markets
- Daily challenge bets (jockey, meeting, tipster challenges & match bets)
